	To be a student of TEC Partnership based at University Centre Grimsby studying the course Early Childhood Studies validated by University Centre Grimsby

	Work with computers and associated information and communication technology to communicate with others and complete assignment work.
	Students are expected to achieve and evidence a total of 440 hours (over the duration of the programme) in an appropriate work-based learning setting. Students must have written confirmation of a placement at the point of enrolment and will attend placement during orientation week.
	There is an expectation for students to work independently at their pace to complete some assignments which are related to their personal and professional development
	To attend lectures and sessions on the specified days and maintain attendance above TEC Partnership expectations of 90%
	Have student finance or other means to pay for the course in place before enrolment

Demonstrate and critically reflect own knowledge and understanding of ethical practice in research and early years' settings.

Apply the underlining concept and principles of inclusive practice by identifying and respecting children's voices in early years' practice.

Communicate information, arguments and analysis to specialist and none specialist audience.

Deploy key techniques of leadership skills and professionalism in early years' practice.
