2. Student Activities

Work with others and contribute to group discussions, debates and group activities during taught sessions;

To attend lectures and sessions on the specified days and times set out in your timetable and maintain attendance above TEC Partnership expectations of 90%;

Be available to attend lectures and sessions and complete work throughout the TEC Partnership Term Dates specified on the TEC Partnership website;

Complete up to 39 hours a week work towards your qualification made up of a range of contact delivery, set work and work towards assessments;

Work collaboratively with placement managers, mentors and supervisor to affect change in a workplace setting.

Have student finance or other means to pay for the course in place before enrolment

Have a confirmed placement and Enhanced DBS before enrolment

Take all reasonable steps to comply with the policies and procedures of TEC partnership.

Demonstrate skills in building partnerships with other professionals, across different sectors, creating effective alliances and networks that contribute to supporting and safeguarding children and young people.
